

Definitions for each category type are provided to assist staff and customers to clarify disposal fees.

|---------------------------------|---|
| Clean fill | Clean dry soil, gravel, or sand (< 40mm average diameter) |
| Recyclables | General domestic recyclables eg cans, bottles, cardboard |
| Car boot or mobile garbage bins | This refers to waste contained within a car boot or a mobile garbage bin with the lid closed |
| Utes, vans & wagons | This refers to any waste contained within a ute, panel van or other type of van or wagon |
| Small trailers | This refers to waste within a standard size trailer (7' x 4' or smaller) without 'hungry boards' or cages. Trailers with 'hungry boards' or cages may be charged at the next fixed fee category (ie large trailer). A small trailer typically holds up to 1m ³ and or 300kg |
| Large trailers | This refers to waste within a larger trailer (> 7' x 4') without 'hungry boards' or cages. Trailers with 'hungry boards' or cages may be charged at the next fixed fee category. Large trailers typically hold 2m ³ and/or 350kg |
| Clean green waste | This refers to all plant or tree matter and also includes clean timber without bolts. Noxious plants & environmental weeds eg lantana, are to be landfilled and not processed with green waste. These items will be charged as unsorted waste |
| Tyres | <p>For sites with no weighbridge tyres are categorised as 'tyre only', or 'tyre on rim' and fees are charged accordingly.</p> <p>For sites with a weighbridge tyres will attract the documented disposal fee whether on a rim or not.</p> <p>The EPA defines waste tyres as used, rejected or unwanted tyres and include whole and shredded tyres</p> |

| Asbestos | <p>This refers to material known to be or suspected to contain asbestos.</p> <p>Class 1 Friable – burnt, contaminated soil, pipe cladding, ceiling insulation etc.</p> <p>Class 2 Bonded – wall sheeting, corrugated roofing etc</p> |
| Chemicals | Household chemicals (eg Herbicides, cleaning products etc) in quantities not more than 20kg/20L can be taken to any waste facility free of charge. Chemicals must be labeled and in a secure container. Facility operators may refuse acceptance of dangerous or unknown chemicals |
| Unsorted waste | Waste presented to facilities that has not been separated or is not intended to be separated into waste types for the purpose of diversion from landfill |
| Sorted waste | Waste presented to facilities that has been separated or will be separated by the transporter into waste types for the purpose of diversion from landfill |
| Scrap metal | Clean ferrous and non-ferrous metal not mixed with other waste |
| 'Weighbridge Ticket' (certification) | Provision of Weighbridge Measurement Certificate issued at Tuncurry Waste Management Centre (which contains a licensed public weighbridge) to determine mass of vehicle, caravans and trailers. Attracts relevant fee |
| Weighbridge Use – 'View Scales' | Visually confirming weight of vehicle/trailer/caravan on weighbridge |
| Animals | This refers to dead animals only |
| Mattresses or bed bases | Mattress OR mattress base component. Items treated separately |
| Treated timber | Koppers logs, structural timber treated with CCA (H1-H6) etc |
