OUR NEW REPORT AND REQUEST SYSTEM

We're all ears when you contact us for information, to request a service, or to report an issue, but until now directing your enquiry to the right place for a response has often been challenging.


Our new streamlined approach means all requests, no matter where they originate, are placed into a centralised system that automatically identifies which part of Council can assist you.

- Requests can be made by phone, email, in person, or online - they will all be placed into the new Report and Request system
- The information we collect is tailored by request type, making sure we get all the details we need from you, in most cases without having to follow up
- You can choose to receive automatic updates as your enquiry is processed
- You can also track your request at any time, using the tracking number provided at the time of your request

The new system also alerts us in real-time to common issues or enquiries coming through, which means we can act quickly to address them.

COMING SOON: BULKY WASTE COLLECTION



Keep an eye out for the Bulky Waste brochure in your letterbox, which provides everything you need to know to get it right.

Right time: Check the collection dates for your zone and place waste out no earlier than one week prior to the start date.

Right stuff: Make sure your bulky waste piles are collected, not rejected, by avoiding our list of prohibited items such as gas bottles, batteries and paint.

Right sort: Metal and whitegoods will be sent for recycling and should be placed in a separate pile to your general and electronic waste.

Right size: For safety reasons there are limits on the volume of waste we can accept, and the weight of individual items.

Right place: Place your waste safely on the kerb, near to where your red and yellow bins usually go - this includes rural residents who use a common collection point. Check to make sure your piles are not obstructing footpaths, driveways or the road.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL ROAD SAFETY

With the new school term starting, make sure you know the rules that are in place to keep our kids safe during school drop-off and pick-up times.

- Slow down to 40km/h when school zone signs and bus lights flash
- Look out for children crossing the road near bus stops, in school zones, and along bus routes
- Give way to buses as they merge back into traffic
- Observe kerbside signs showing where you can and can't stop your car in school zones



SLOW DOWN IN TOWN



Did you know the speed limit in all built-up areas in NSW is 50km / hour?

- The 50km default limit applies 24/7 to all urban roads without a speed sign
- Reduced speed limits still apply in school zones, where roadworks are underway, and in other special areas
- Built-up areas are where there are buildings on the land next to the road, or where there are streetlights along the road
